Competition requirements:

1) Application and \$15 application fee are due by **Monday, November 1, 2021.**
NO APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THIS DATE.

2) The length of the audition time is twelve (12) minutes. The student will have one minute to enter the stage, 10 minutes to perform and one minute to exit the stage. Please make the appropriate cuts in your music to limit your audition to no longer than ten minutes.

3) A grand piano will be provided, and a second piano for accompanying piano applicants will also be provided. You are responsible for arranging your own accompanist.

PLEASE NOTE: If an applicant is not able to perform with the orchestra on Sunday, April 24, 2022, they will not be considered eligible for this competition.

The Euclid Symphony Orchestra reserves the right to ask the winning entrant to perform portions of larger works in the final performance with the orchestra. The Euclid Symphony Orchestra also reserves the right to ask the winning entrant to perform an alternate piece other than that which was played at the time of the audition. These decisions will be made at the discretion of the Music Director and Euclid Symphony Orchestra Board of Directors. Young artist's bio and headshot will be collected for publicity purposes.
