Mission Statement

The Euclid Symphony Orchestra cultivates community through music, fosters appreciation of orchestral music, educates children about the orchestral genre and provides an outlet for musicians to perform and develop musicianship.

History

The Euclid Symphony Orchestra was organized on January 8, 1961, after a three year effort by Melvin Robb, then Principal of Euclid Central Junior High School. Though not a musician himself, Mr. Robb felt that a community needed an orchestra and sixty musicians from Euclid, East Cleveland, South Euclid and Willoughby joined together to form Euclid Orchestra, as it was originally known. Support was given by the Euclid Inter-Service Club Council and member service clubs. We have been fortunate to have many musical directors. In 1961, Harry Hershey was appointed first director.

Today, the orchestra presents five concerts a season, as well as a children's concert, at the Shore Cultural Centre in Euclid, which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Managed by a volunteer board, and funded solely through donations and ticket sales.

Music Director Jimmie Parker, Sr.



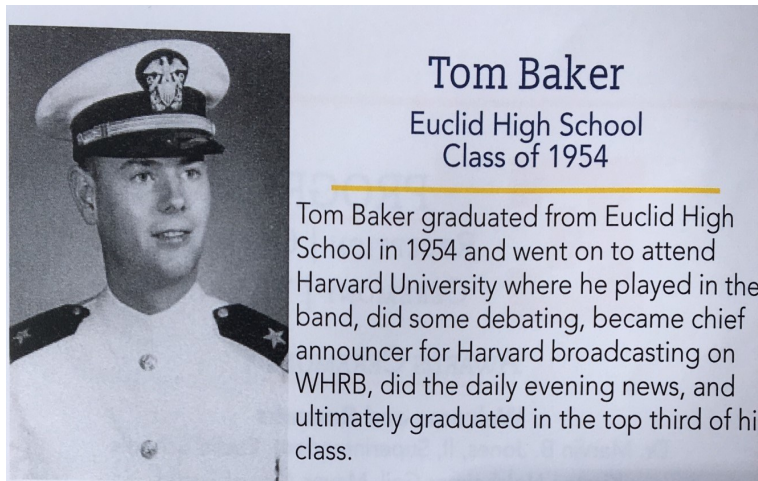
Jimmie A. Parker Sr. is a multifaceted musician and entrepreneur whose passion for music and commitment to excellence have propelled him to success as a musician, conductor, composer, and educator. As the CEO of Dominion Global Music Group, The Color of Music Inc, and Its Just Music LLC, Jimmie has established himself as a leader in the industry, with a passion for classical, jazz, and contemporary music. From a young age, Jimmie showcased his musical talent, discovering his gift at the age of five. By the age of ten, he was already playing the organ and piano at his local church, demonstrating a natural aptitude for music. This early passion led him to pursue formal training in classical piano and contrabass performance at the School of Creative and Performing Arts in Cincinnati, Ohio.

Jimmie's musical prowess extends beyond performing and recording. He currently serves as the principal keyboardist for the Cleveland Philharmonic Orchestra and a past student conductor of the Cleveland State University Symphony Orchestra and Cleveland State University Big Band. He has also performed with the Lakeland Symphony, Lakeland Civic Band, Cleveland Wind Ensemble, and the Skatch Andersson Big Band. His involvement in these prestigious ensembles highlights his exceptional musical abilities and dedication to excellence.

Furthermore, Jimmie A. Parker, Sr. is a respected professor at Case Western Reserve University, where he teaches Digital Music Composition and Production. He also shares his passion for the creative arts as a music fundamentals teacher at the Superior School for the Performing Arts in the East Cleveland School District. Tom Baker Young Artist Competition

In the 2019-2020 season, the Euclid Symphony Orchestra held its inaugural Young Artists Competition, named after long-time friend, donor and board member of the ESO Tom Baker.

The competition is open to students age 18 and younger who are advanced musicians (instrumental or vocal) capable of playing appropriate level repertoire, including concerto-level (or equivalent) virtuosic works.

The competition winner will receive a \$500 cash prize and a performance with the Euclid Symphony Orchestra.

2024 Tom Baker Young Artist Competition Winner Louis Wang



Louis Wang, 16, from Great Neck, New York, is currently a junior at Solon High School in Ohio. He started his formal music training in piano at the age of four and cello at the age of ten. By 5th grade, Louis achieved New York State School Music Association (NYSSMA) Level 6 certification for piano and Level 5 in cello with perfect scores for both instruments. He shifted his focus to concentrate on cello after moving to Ohio five years ago and has been playing as a member in the Cleveland Orchestra

Youth Orchestra (COYO) performing regularly at the Severance Hall since 2021. Taking a break from piano for more than three years, Louis has rekindled his passion for piano after attending one of Kissin's concert in Cleveland and had since been independently exploring various pieces in which he found a deep connection with Rachmaninoff's piano concertos.

Louis has participated in local and state auditions and competitions and has received many awards. He was the winner for the Cleveland Cello Society Scholarship Competition junior division in 2020 and performed as a soloist in the 2021 winner's recital livestream in Bop Stop at the Music Settlement. He sat as the principal cellist in the 2023 OMEA Northeast Regional Orchestra and has been selected to participate in the 2024 OMEA All-State Orchestra. Louis was also the winner of the 2024 Frieda Schumacher Young Artist Competition and the 2024 Euclid Symphony Orchestra's Young Artists Competition.

In his free time, Louis enjoys playing video games and basketball with his friends as well as watching music documentaries. His favorite place to be is grandma's house in Flushing, Queens NY.
